**Year of St Joseph**

On the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church, Pope Francis proclaimed a 'Year of St. Joseph' until 8<sup>th</sup> December 2021.

In his decree Pope Francis reminds us, especially at this time of pandemic, of the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation." [Vatican News]

**Baptisms**

A number of inquiries have been received recently about Baptisms. Under the present Covid 19 restrictions Baptisms are not taking place except in the case of an emergency.

When restrictions are eased sufficiently and Baptisms are allowed take place again, a number of dates will be set aside so that those awaiting the Sacrament can be baptised. These will take place on Friday evenings or on Saturday afternoons.

It should be noted that when Baptisms resume the numbers allowed into the church for the ceremony will continue to be restricted.

Parents and Godparents of those awaiting Baptism are reminded that Baptism is the First Sacrament and through Baptism they are making a commitment to guide the child through life in the company of Christ.
